

- Distribution of materials by an attendee to other attendees of a community group meeting held after school hours in accordance with policy GKD(LOCAL) or a noncurriculum-related student group meeting held in accordance with FNAB(LOCAL).
- Distribution for electioneering purposes during the time a school facility is being used as a polling place, in accordance with state law.

All nonschool materials distributed under these circumstances must be removed from district property immediately following the event at which the materials are distributed.

## Dress and Grooming

The district’s dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student’s personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:

<b>Shorts</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Must be</b> appropriately sized and worn at the natural waistline.</li> <li>• Biking/jogger’s shorts, cutoffs, boxer shorts, coaching shorts, short shorts, or wind/athletic, board shorts <b>will NOT</b> be allowed.</li> <li>• Shorts cannot be shorter than a dollar bill width above the knee (see above).</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No layering of shorts will be allowed. Examples such as biking or spandex shorts under short shorts or boxer shorts being worn over other clothing, etc., are strictly prohibited.</li> </ul>
<b>Pants (Short or Long)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Shall be appropriately sized and worn at the natural waistline.</li> <li>• <b>No baggy pants will be allowed.</b></li> <li>• Holes in jeans cannot be above the mid-thigh area.</li> <li>• Sweat pants, athletic/wind pants are also prohibited.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No pants made of spandex or other form fitting material: yoga pants, leggings, jeggings (see notation above)</li> </ul>
<b>Shirts</b> <b>Blouses</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <u>All shirts</u> must be appropriately sized and tucked in pants for boys.</li> <li>• Mesh or see through garments are <b>unacceptable</b> unless worn over an acceptable garment.</li> <li>• Muscle shirts, tank tops, spaghetti straps, strapless, and undershirts must be covered with an acceptable garment.</li> <li>• Any garment that allows the midriff to be exposed is unacceptable.</li> <li>• Necklines on any garment shall NOT be so low that they pose a distraction.</li> <li>•</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No off the shoulder shirts or blouses</li> <li>• No visible undergarments.</li> </ul>
<b>Shoes</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Appropriate shoes must be worn.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• House shoes/bedroom slippers are prohibited</li> </ul>
<b>Jewelry</b> <b>Accessories</b> <b>Tattoos</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Girls may wear earrings that do NOT pose a safety hazard or distraction.</li> <li>• Students are NOT permitted to wear rings or studs in any place other than the ear (even if covered).</li> <li>• Boys cannot have earrings/studs.</li> <li>• <b>ALL tattoos</b> MUST be appropriately covered.</li> <li>• <b>No hats/scarves/sweat bands</b> (other than in PE.... athletics)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Accessories with inappropriate decorations or advertisements are prohibited.</li> <li>• Wallet chains, dog collars, pointed studded bracelets are not allowed.</li> </ul>

	<p>or other head wear are allowed on campus.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Non-prescription sunglasses or mirrored glasses are NOT allowed to be worn in the building.</li> <li>• Combs, curlers, rollers, and/or picks are NOT allowed to be worn in school.</li> </ul>	
<b>Hair</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Beards and mustaches are not allowed. Sideburns must be kept neatly trimmed and cannot become a beard on the face.</li> <li>• Boys' hair should be cut above tops of ears and above collar.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Hair styles that cause a distraction are prohibited.</li> </ul>
<b>General</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Coats and jackets cannot be longer than mid-thigh.</li> <li>• Revealing or excessively tight garments are prohibited.</li> <li>• Appropriate foundation garments and/or undergarments must be worn.</li> <li>• Backless or cut-out sundresses and tops are NOT acceptable.</li> <li>• Pajamas or garments that allow the undergarments to be seen are NOT allowed.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No black or dark brown lip liner, lipstick, or nail polish may be worn.</li> <li>• Any item may NOT be worn in any way that reflects gang affiliation or conceals contraband. This includes, but is not limited to, any item that depicts the occult, gang membership, death, suicide, violence, beer, sexual connotations, tobacco, drugs, alcohol or any picture and/or slogan which could be offensive to any racial or ethnic group. This includes hats, shirts, jackets, buttons, bandannas, or trademark emblems generally associated with the above</li> </ul>

If the principal determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the school's dress code, the student will be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school. If not corrected, the student may be assigned to in-school suspension for the remainder of the day, until the problem is corrected, or until a parent or designee brings an acceptable change of clothing to the school. Repeated offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.

## **Electronic Devices and Technology Resources**

### **Possession and Use of Personal Telecommunications Devices, Including Mobile Telephones**

For safety purposes, the district permits students to possess personal mobile telephones; however, these devices must remain turned off during the instructional day, including during all testing, unless they are being used for approved instructional purposes. A student must have approval to possess other telecommunications devices such as netbooks, laptops, tablets, or other portable computers.

The use of mobile telephones or any device capable of capturing images is strictly prohibited in locker rooms or restroom areas while at school or at a school-related or school-sponsored event.

If a student uses a telecommunications device without authorization during the school day, the device will be confiscated. The student/parent may pick up the confiscated telecommunications device from the principal's office for a fee of \$15.
